ORGANISING AUTHORITY

The organising authority is Whitstable Yacht Club.

<u>RULES</u>

The racing shall be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2025 - 2029, the prescriptions of the Royal Yachting Association (RYA), the appropriate class rules, Canterbury City Council Water Safety Rules and the Sailing Instructions for this event. In the event of conflict these Sailing Instructions shall prevail.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The event is open to any member of a recognised sailing/yacht club.

REGISTRATION

Competitors must sign on before going afloat to race in accordance with WYC Sailing Instructions; see Safety below

PROGRAMME

The first race Warning Signal will be no earlier than 10.54hrs on Saturday 24 May. The programme is scheduled as follows:

The racing will be run as "all in" handicap using average lap times with a single start for all classes.

SCORING SYSTEM

There are 6 races scheduled of which at least 2 shall be completed to constitute a series. The Low Points Scoring System, RRS A4 will apply. Each boat shall discard her worst two scores; this alters RRS A2 and WYC SI 17.1. In the event of 4 races sailed, 3 will count, and if 3 races or less being sailed all results will count.

COURSES

Courses will be set in Whitstable Bay, approximately North West of Whitstable Yacht Club. The course configuration will be displayed on the WYC course board. Starts and finishes will either be from the club line or a committee boat. Starts and the starting sequence will be displayed on the WYC course board and at the briefing.

RISK STATEMENT

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- they are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- they are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- they accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- the provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- the provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- it is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this
 event referred to in the Sailing Instructions and to attend any safety briefing held at the
 venue; and
- their boat is adequately insured, with cover of at least £3,000,000 against third party claims.

SAFETY - SIGNING OUT and SIGNING IN

All competitors shall sign out on the form provided at the veranda railings before launching and shall sign back in on the same form as soon as possible after coming ashore, and certainly WITHIN 30 MINUTES OF THE FINISH OF THE LAST BOAT IN THE LAST RACE OF THE DAY. This procedure is for the safety of competitors and failure to comply may result in disqualification or a £5 fine, which will be donated to the RNLI.

PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded to the first 3 boats. Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Sailing Committee. Prizes will be awarded at the Annual Prizegiving.
